Wright State Physicians

Wright State Orthopaedic Surgery, Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation has grown over the past year. There are now 11 providers in the group that has merged with Dr. Michael Johnson and the Division of Plastic Surgery. The department provides a full spectrum of care for musculoskeletal disease. There are clinical offices at Miami Valley Hospital and Atrium Medical Center, and Satellites in Centerville, Beavercreek, Huber Heights, Troy and Sidney. The Division of Plastic Surgery serves patients at Miami Valley Hospital and Good Samaritan Hospital. The goal is to provide state-of-the-art general and subspecialty care for patients with musculoskeletal injury and disease.

Orthopaedic surgery is a broad field with many subspecialties. The group emphasizes subspecialty care as each physician has their area of concentration. In the Division of Sports Medicine, there are four physicians providing care for Wright State Athletics, the University of Dayton, and several area high schools including Beavercreek High School. Dr. Matthew Lawless focuses his practice on knee reconstruction and replacement and is the team physician for Wright State Athletics and Beavercreek and Fairborn high schools. He sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital and the Ollie Davis Medical Center in Beavercreek. Dr. Michael Herbenick and Dr. Joe Rubino recently assumed care of University of Dayton Athletics, as well as Miami University Middletown. They each concentrate on surgical care of the athlete, as well as shoulder and knee reconstruction. Dr. Herbenick sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital and Miami Valley South offices. Dr. Rubino sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital and the Atrium Medical Center. Dr. Corey Ellis provides primary care for Wright State Athletics and Beavercreek High School, and sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital and at Ollie Davis.

Dr. James Binski focuses on joint reconstruction and trauma to compliment his practice in deformity correction at Miami Valley Hospital. He has become an international authority on the use of external fixation in both trauma and deformity reconstruction. Dr. Michael Prayson focuses on acute trauma and is the orthopaedic trauma director at Miami Valley Hospital.

The Division of Foot and Ankle Surgery includes Dr. Michael Barnett, Dr. Richard Laughlin and Dr. Greg Barbour, and treats all foot and ankle problems from both an orthopaedic perspective and a podiatric perspective. This group treats all disease and injury involving the foot and ankle, as well as providing orthotics and shoe wear. Dr. Barnett sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital, Atrium Medical Center, and Miami Valley South. Dr. Barbour sees patients at Miami Valley Hospital, Good Samaritan Hospital, and Miami Valley South.

Dr. Matthew Di Paola focuses on shoulder surgery, both acute injury and joint reconstruction. He sees patients at the Dayton VA Medical Center and Atrium Medical Center satellite office, as well as Miami Valley Hospital. Dr. Greg Stover, who recently joined the department, specializes in general orthopaedics in Troy and Sidney, practicing at Upper Valley Medical Center and Wilson Memorial Hospitals. Dr. Michael Johnson works at both Miami Valley Hospital and Good Samaritan Hospital providing plastic surgical services, as well as burn care and hand surgery.

The group has grown to provide an expanding array of specialized services. The goals are to continue to grow to provide state-of-the-art care for patients with injury or disease affecting bones, joints and the musculoskeletal system.
